Recognizing Synonyms

A synoym is a word or phrase which is closest in meaning to a given word. It may often replace the given word. Synonyms are important not only in writing but also in reading. The answers to many comprehension questions depend on restatements, which are often based on synonyms. This chapter focuses on expanding your vocabulary through the introduction of synonyms. If you want to improve your English, you should do your best to increase your word power by learning synonyms
